App Name and Password





Some of the apps require a name and a password to access them and sign into later.

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iPad Box Information and Learning Buttons





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| <p>1. iPad Pro Box Front</p> |  |
| <p>2. iPad Pro Box Back</p> |  |
| <p>3. iPad Pro Serial Number - keep the box in a place where you can find it. You may need to reference your Serial Number or other information on the back of the box.</p> |  |

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| <p>4. Box Contents: iPad, charger cable and plug.</p> <p>Fold out “Welcome to iPad Pro” and Safety and Handling sheet.</p> |  |
| <p>5. Serial number and model Number - located on back of iPad.</p> |  |
| <p>6. Power On – “On” Button- located on top, right side. Hold for 5 seconds.</p> |  |
| <p>7a. Power Off - Press the Power Button and the Volume Up Button together for about 5 seconds to shut down the screen. A power off slider should appear.</p> |  |





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| <p>7b. Power Off – press and slide on the power off slider to turn off. The yellow arrow is pointing where to press and slide.</p> |  |
| <p>8. Volume Up – press the top button.</p> |  |
| <p>9. Volume Down – press the bottom button.</p> |  |
| <p>10. iPad Pencil Charger - attach Apple Pencil to the magnetic connector on the side below the Volume buttons. Apple Pencil is a separate purchase.</p> |  |





Charging




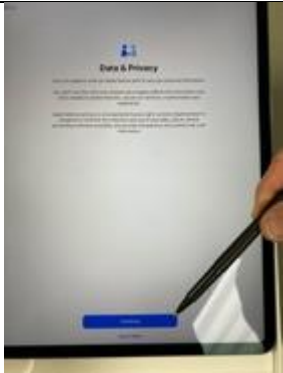
NOTE: It takes approximately **3 hours to charge the iPad** while not being used.




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| <p>11. Battery Indicator – is located in top right-hand corner of the screen. This indicates the battery% available.</p> |  |
| <p>12a. Charging - the charging cable can plug into the iPad and Power Block with either end.</p> |  |
| <p>12b. Charging - when charging, ensure the cable “clicks” when pushing it into the iPad. You can feel the “click” and even hear it.</p> |  |
| <p>12c. Charging - a lightning bolt will appear in the top right-hand corner when charging.</p> |  |

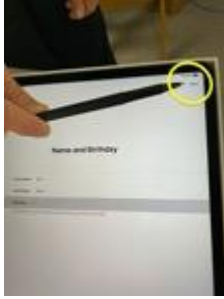



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| <p>17. Device-to-device migration - If you have another Apple device (iOS 12.4 or later) and choose to set up the iPad on the same Apple ID, you can use this screen to transfer data automatically. For example, data includes all of your contacts.</p> |  |
| <p>18. Set up manually - when not migrating two iOS devices, select “Set up Manually.”</p> |  |
| <p>19. Select country.</p> |  |
| <p>20. Choose Wi-Fi network.</p> |  |

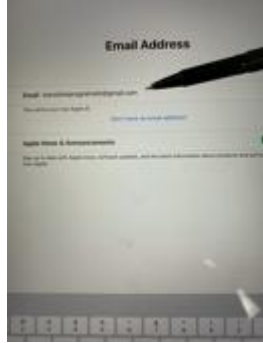

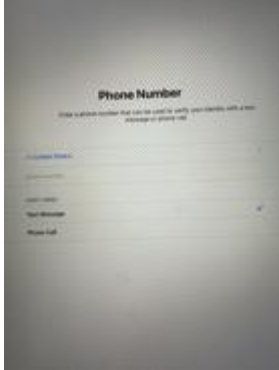
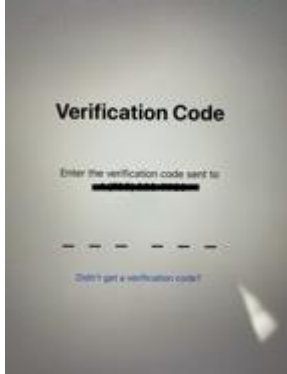

| <p>26. Create passcode. IT IS OPTIONAL. Tap on Passcode Options at bottom of screen.</p> |  |
| <p>27. Passcode options: see 2 boxes below.</p> |  |
| <p>1. Custom Alphanumeric Code – Combination of Letters and Numbers (ex. A12BC3D).</p> <p>2. 6 Digit Custom Numeric Code – Numbers only (ex.123456).</p> | <p>3. 4 Digit Numeric Code – provides a simplified passcode (ex. 1234).</p> <p>Custom Alphanumeric and 6 Digit Custom Numeric are the most secure, however, if the individual has memory issues, either using a 4 Digit Code or no code at all maybe the best option.</p> |





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| <p>28. Create a Passcode - For this example <u>we did not use a passcode.</u> They can be hard to remember.</p> |  |
| <p>29. Apps & Data. These are the options that will show up on the screen.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Restore from iCloud back up2. Restore from Mac or PC3. Move data from Android4. Don't transfer Apps and Data- most frequently used and the one used for this example. |  |
| <p>31. Sign up with Apple ID – Individuals will need their email/Apple ID to continue. Your Apple ID is the email that is linked to your device. The password is one you set up to go with your email that is linked to the device if you choose. The password can be different if the user chooses. Please refer to your iPad Information Log.</p> |  |
| <p>32a. Apple ID – If you have an existing Apple device, enter your existing Apple ID (email address) here. If not, continue to 32b.</p> |  |





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| <p>32b. Don't have an Apple ID. If you do not have an Apple ID, tap on the statement indicated by the pointer. This way you can create a free Apple ID which will be in the next slide.</p> |  |
| <p>33. Create a free Apple ID. Tap on "Create a Free Apple ID."</p> |  |
| <p>34a. Name and Birthday. This picture is showing the information that will need to be entered to create a new Apple ID.</p> |  |
| <p>34b. Close-up of Name and Birthday – so you can see the screen and information needed</p> |  |





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| <p>35. Enter name and birthday, then tap on “NEXT.”</p> |  |
| <p>36. Enter Email address if you have one. If not, go to next box.</p> |  |
| <p>37a. Don't have an email address. Tap on “Don't have an email address?”</p> |  |
| <p>37b. Creating email address: User may need help creating this. Enter your email address.</p> <p>Note: Passwords for Apple ID: Apple requires 8 characters in their password and must include at least one upper case and one lower case and one number.</p> |  |

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| <p>42. Terms & Conditions – Read the Terms and Conditions and then tap on “Agree” in the bottom right-hand corner of the screen.</p> |  |
| <p>43. Creating a new Apple ID – it may take a few minutes to create your account.</p> |  |
| <p>44. Express settings - Tap “Continue” at the bottom of the screen.</p> |  |
| <p>45. Keep iPad up-to-date. Select “Continue.”</p> |  |



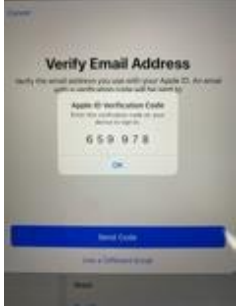

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| <p>46. Siri - This is a great feature to use. It's recommended to set up Siri to allow you to use your voice to ask question, such as "What's the temperature today?" or "What appointments do I have today?" It can be used to also set alarms.</p> <p>Select "Continue" at the bottom of the screen.</p> |  |
| <p>47a. Siri set up.</p> <p>Note: You will be asked to talk to Siri and the screen will prompt you on what to say. There are several of these requested for the set up. When finished select continue.</p> |  |
| <p>47b. Siri set up – another prompt for completing the Siri set up.</p> |  |
| <p>48. Siri is ready – Siri set up is complete. Siri will recognize your voice whenever you say, "Hey Siri."</p> <p>Tap "Continue" at the bottom of the screen.</p> |  |





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| <p>49. Improve Siri & Dictation - allows Apple to store audio of your Siri and Dictation interactions from this iPad.</p> <p>Select “Share Audio Recordings” at the bottom of the screen.</p> |  |
| <p>50. Screen time – locks out programs to limit App use. Select “Set up later” at the bottom of the screen.</p> |  |
| <p>51. App Analytics – Tap “Share with App Developers” at the bottom of the screen.</p> |  |
| <p>52. True Tone Display – Tap “Continue” at the bottom of the screen.</p> |  |

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| <p>53. Appearance – select either Light or Dark screen appearance based on preference. 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| <p>61. Settings App – Select the Settings App.</p> |  |
| <p>62a. Verify email address – Select “Verify Email.” The email that you use for your Apple ID will receive a verification email. You need to open the email and select “Validate Hyperlink.”</p> |  |
| <p>62b. Select Code – tap on select code.</p> |  |
| <p>63. Select “Finish setting up iPad.” And follow prompts.</p> |  |
